Overview

Premenstrual syndrome is a chronic condition experienced by menstruating women which is characterised by distressing physical, behavioural and psychological symptoms that regularly recur during the luteal phase of the menstrual cycle. These symptoms disappear or significantly diminish by the end of menstruation. PMDD is a severe form of PMS. Approximately 800,000 women in the UK are suffering with severe PMS/PMDD.

In this session, we will hear the journey of 3 women diagnosed with PMDD. We will discuss the presentation, aetiology and management of this condition in Primary Care as well as when to consider onward referral.
